

Breeder Check List



The breeder is a member of a National Canine Organisation eg Dogs Australia (ANKC) and has a kennel prefix.
They may be a member of a Golden Retriever breed club, have excellent breed knowledge and are dedicated to the breed.
Parents have hip & elbow scores, a current eye certificate and heart certificate & DNA testing.
Breeder welcomes questions & will ask you questions, they are not just interested in a quick sale.
The breeder does not have an endless supply of puppies of different ages and breeds. A good breeder usually has a wait list.
Puppies are whelped in the home and raised in a clean safe environment.
The breeder will vet you when you visit them and watch how you interact with the adults and puppies.
You can meet the mother (possibly the sire) and relatives. The breeder can discuss why this combination was chosen.
Puppies have toys & enrichment. The breeder may follow a raising program like puppy culture. Can show records of this.
The breeder will know each individual puppy and be able to choose the best match for the lifestyle of prospective owners.
Puppies are clean, and well-grown. They are fed a quality diet. They are vet checked, vaccinated and microchipped.
Puppies are happy to be handled, confident, well socialised and show no sign of fear or aggression.
Puppies come with a certified pedigree, detailed information pack, (diet sheet, vaccination record, vet check, and puppy guide book)
Breeder has contract of sale, and provides a health guarantee. Puppies may come with free insurance and a food sample.
Breeder offers a lifetime of support and follows their state or countries legislation on the breeding and selling of dogs.
